# Runway Incursion Prevention – stop at the red light

Runway incursions are one of the main safety related incidents at airports and could lead to catastrophic accidents.

A runway incursion is any occurrence at an aerodrome involving the incorrect presence of an aircraft, vehicle or person on the protected area of a surface designated for the landing and take-off of aircraft. Its contributing factors may be unfamiliarity with the airport layout, misinterpretation of a radio call and/or performing tasks with head down during taxiing.




### Runway Incursion Prevention @ Zurich Airport

Zurich Airport's three converging runways make runway crossing a standard procedure for almost every aircraft movement. Knowing the hot spots and special procedures is crucial to prevent runway incursions at Zurich Airport.

- Never cross an illuminated (red) stop bar neither short of Runways nor on Taxiways.
- Only proceed past a stop bar when ATC provides the appropriate verbal instruction AND the stop bar light is extinguished.
- If unsafe situations or confusion occur, stop taxiing and contact ATC or Apron Control for assistance.


#### Runway Safety Markings

Stop bars are a series of unidirectional red lights embedded in the pavement at right angles to the taxiway centerline, at the associated runway holding position.
